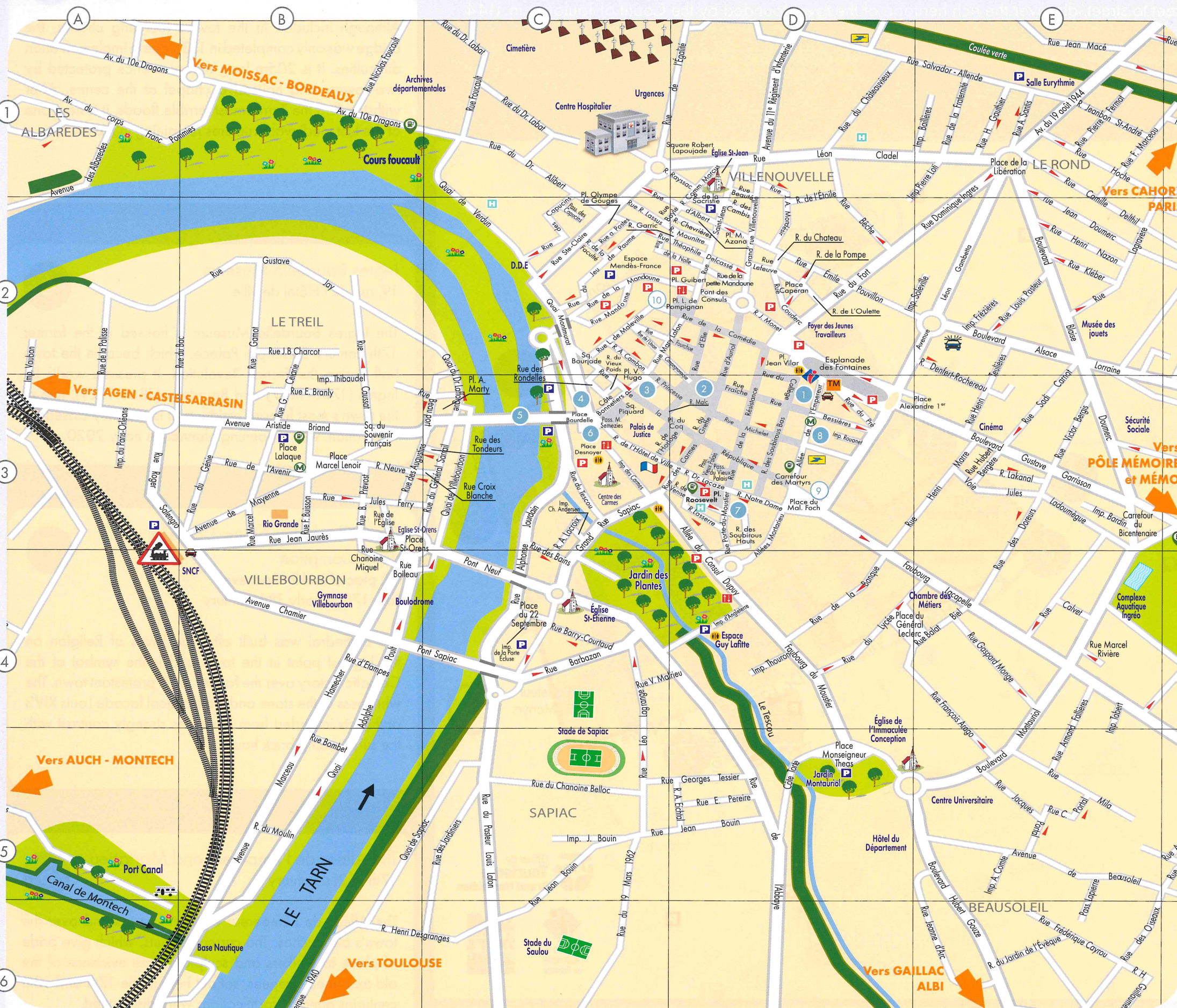

The Ancien Collège

2, rue du Collège
Late 17th century

The Jesuits arrived in 1629 following the surrender of the protestant town and acquired a private mansion in 1676 where they built a new college. The building has been extended several times and is structured around two vast courtyards and a chapel, the current-day Saint-Joseph Church. The dormitory housing the internal students was above the vaults of the church.

Place Nationale

17th – early 18th century

The Place Nationale has been set in the town centre since the 12th century, and is also one of the focal points for public life. It was gutted by two fires in 1614 and 1649 then completely rebuilt in brick. Internal courtyards and beautiful brick or wooden staircases extended by walkways are hidden behind its harmonious façades.

Eglise Saint-Jacques

62, rue de la République
13th, 17th and 18th century

An excellent example of 13th-century, southern Gothic architecture, the Saint-Jacques Church was transformed into a watch tower during the Wars of Religion. The cannonball impacts of the 1621 siege can still be seen on its façade. It was partly rebuilt in the 17th century and features a fine bell tower, modelled on the Basilica of St Sernin in Toulouse.

Natural History Museum

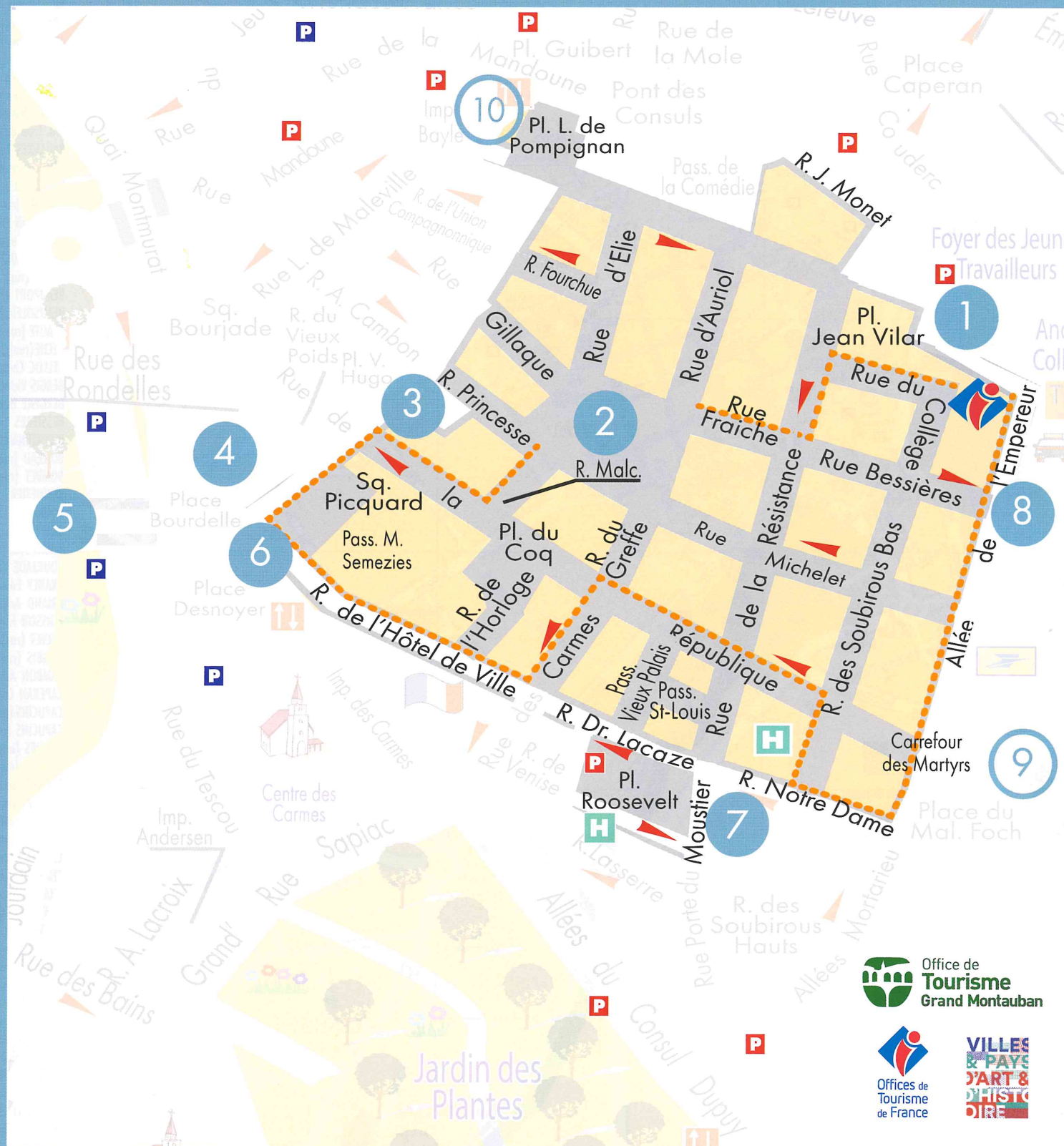
2, place Antoine Bourdelle

The museum was opened in 1854 and is located in the former palace of the Cour des Aides (sovereign court). It is renowned for its large collection of birds, a beautiful set of mammals and fossils from the Quercy Phosphorites. It also has a fragment of the famous Orgueil meteorite which fell near Montauban in 1864.

Montauban

From street to street, discover the rich heritage of the town founded by the Count of Toulouse in 1144.

This is the perfect walking route to discover the major landmarks of Montauban.



The Old Bridge

Early 14th century

Although included in the town's founding charter, the bridge was only completed in 1335 due to implementation difficulties. It is 205m long and was once protected by two towers and housed a chapel at the centre. After withstanding the Tarn's most terrible floods, it is now one of the last medieval structures remaining in the town.

Ingres Bourdelle Museum

19, rue de l'Hôtel de ville

The Ingres Bourdelle Museum is housed in the former 17th century Episcopal Palace, which became the town hall during the French Revolution. It presents works by Ingres (1780-1867) and Bourdelle (1861-1929), two of the town's most famous residents. It is currently closed for renovation, with reopening planned in early 2020.

The Cathedral of Notre-Dame de l'Assomption

13, place Franklin Roosevelt
Late 17th – early 18th century

The cathedral was built after the Wars of Religion on the highest point in the town and is the symbol of the Catholic victory over the former rebel protestant town. The whiteness of the stone and the classical façade Louis XIV's architects imported from Versailles strongly contrast with the surrounding brick houses.

The Allées de l'Empereur and Mortarieu

17th to 21st century

The Allées de l'Empereur et Mortarieu extend over the town's old ditches. The current layouts, which give pride of place to walkers and sculptures, are evidence of the old tree-lined avenues, set out here in the 17th and 18th centuries after the fortifications were dismantled.
